City updates timing on ONE McKinney 2040 Comprehensive Plan

McKINNEY, Texas (March 3, 2017) – At the Feb. 20 City Council Work Session, City Council reviewed recent transportation planning initiatives and their impact on the completion of the ONE McKinney 2040 Comprehensive Plan Update. During the meeting, City Council discussed the development of the city's Master Thoroughfare Plan with regard to the concept of a new controlled-access facility as an option to address regional mobility pressures and alleviate anticipated future traffic concerns on U.S. 380 (University Drive).

As a key component of the city's Comprehensive Plan, these recent transportation discussions have taken a front seat for consideration by city leaders and community stakeholders. Although the city originally looked forward to adoption of the ONE McKinney 2040 Comprehensive Plan in May of 2017, the city is now refocusing its timing and outreach efforts to allow for additional evaluation of transportation options, continued public outreach and further development of the transportation-related items of the comprehensive plan.
