



COVID-19 Food Establishment Regulations

In an effort to reduce the transmission of COVID-19, the City of McKinney reminds food establishments to use extra precautions to protect the public by following these regulations.

EMPLOYEES

- **Wash hands** frequently and thoroughly for 20 seconds using hot water and soap.
- **Avoid touching face, mouth, nose and eyes.**
- **Wear gloves** when handling all food products and food contact surfaces.
- **Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue** when you cough or sneeze.
- **Cough or sneeze away from** exposed food.
- **Dispose of tissues** immediately, then **wash your hands.**
- **Store cell phones and personal items** away from food contact areas. There should be minimal-to-no contact with these items.

HIGH-TRAFFIC CUSTOMER AREAS

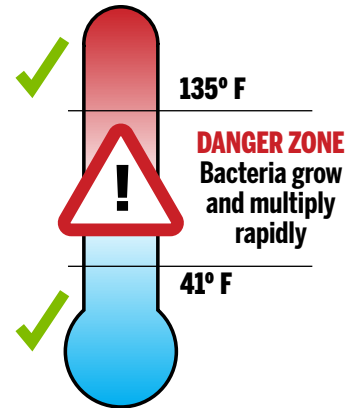
- **Stock restrooms** with soap and paper towels at all times.
- **Provide hot water in restrooms** that reaches a minimum of 100°F.
- **Sanitize all high contact areas frequently.**
 - CDC recommends using 1/3 cup bleach to 1 gallon water.

SANITIZING PROCEDURES

- **Wash, rinse and sanitize** all dishes and utensils.
- **Follow manufacturer recommendations** and allow surfaces to air dry properly.
- **Use only approved sanitizers and cleaners** allowed for food establishments.
 - Hot water sanitizers must be 171°F.
 - Chlorine must be 50-100ppm.
 - Quaternary ammonium must be 200ppm.
- **Do not combine cleaners** of any type.

PROPER FOOD TEMPERATURES

- **Cook food thoroughly** to the proper temperature requirements.
- **Do not leave food between 41°F and 135°F for more than 4 hours.**
- **Discard food** that has been left between 41°F and 135°F for more than 4 hours. It cannot be used or sold.



IMPORTANT WHAT-IFS

- **Stop food operations** if you run out of soap, paper towels or sanitizer. Resume operations when supplies are available.
